FROM FATHER RANING

One Sunday at Mass as the priest was giving his homily, a little baby in the front row suddenly started crying loudly. The mother did her best to pacify the child but nothing worked. So finally she got up and started to walk down the aisle to take the baby out of church. The priest stopped his preaching, and very compassionately called out to the mother, "That's OK, you don't have to leave, the child isn't disturbing me." The young woman turned around and said, "No, but you're disturbing the child!"

YOUR FAITH HAS HEALED YOU. In Greek, the same word (sodzo) means both heal and save. Thus the gospel writers can use this word to join physical healing from illness or disease with spiritual healing from sin (whatever breaks down our relationship with God). Those who approach Jesus for bodily healing are also cleansed from spiritual sin and restored to relationship with God and the community. The outer healing alerts us to the inner reconciliation that happens when we commit ourselves in faith to a relationship with Jesus.

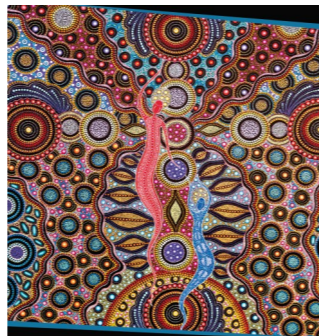
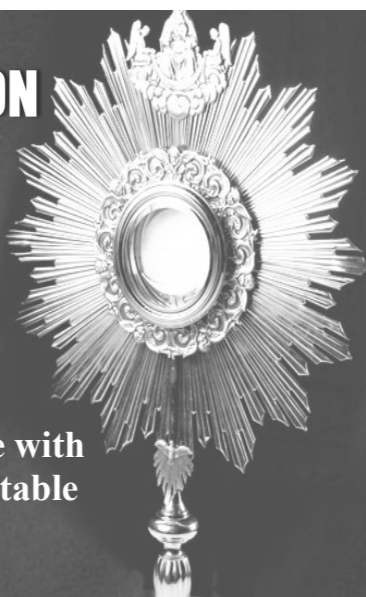
- First Reading: God created us for life and shared divine life with us.
