# FROM FATHER RANING

A newspaper reporter went to interview a successful businessman. "How did you make all those millions?" he inquired.

"I'm glad you asked," said the businessman. "It's a wonderful story. When my wife and I got married, we had exactly five cents to our name. So I took that nickel, went down to the grocery, bought an apple, shined it up, and sold it for ten cents.

"What did you do then?" asked the reporter.

"Well," he said, "I bought two more apples, shined them up, and sold them for twenty cents."

At this point the reporter was sure he had a great story. "Then what?" he asked excitedly.

"Then," said the business man, "my father-in-law died and left us \$50 million!"

When we see someone who really is great or wonderful - Mother Teresa or maybe just an extraordinary friend - we wonder where all that goodness came from: The very question they were asking about Jesus in Sunday's Gospel: Where did he get all this?

The answer is not complex: Jesus came from a family who loved him in all the right ways from the very beginning, a family who day by day gave him all the pieces from which he could build a good life. That's the first part of the answer.

But there was something more, something that made him very special: It was the power that came from his bond with our Father. Because Jesus was entirely open to Him, our Father was able to take all the good that had been passed down to Jesus by generations of family and friends, and our Father was able to make of Jesus a man of goodness beyond all imagination.

PROPHET: Prophets are those who speak for or on behalf of God to the community. Their major task was not to foretell the future but to forth-tell God's presence in the events affecting their nation. In a world that that did not clearly separate issues of religion and politics, the prophets reminded the kings that God was present and active in the political and social crises of the community. They demanded that courses of action in times of crisis must follow what God desires and not simply what is most expedient according to human political wisdom.

Ezekiel is commanded to prophesy even though his audience will be First Reading:

unreceptive.

What gives me the courage to go on when others are unreceptive to my witness?

Second Reading: Paul learns the hard way that his weakness is a showcase for God's

strength.

When have my weakness been an unexpected source of blessing for me and

others around me?

Gospel: Jesus' neighbours were unreceptive because they could not see beyond their

rigid stereotypes.

How might I be missing what Jesus is calling me to discover?
