# **From Father Raning**

## The Feast of the Epiphany

The word "Epiphany" comes from the Greek word meaning to manifest, to show. On this day Jesus was manifested, shown forth to the whole Gentile world represented by the Magi. They found Jesus by following a star and brought gifts of myrrh, frankincense and gold.

Myrrh is a dried resin used for burial.

It is also used for healing. This gift was intended to forecast Jesus' healing ministry. It also pointed to his death on the cross and burial.

The first step of the spiritual life is to bury some stuff. What is there in our life that needs to be buried? Myrrh was also used for healing. What is there in our life that needs to be healed? Besides physical ailments, are there any emotional scars or broken relationships?

Frankincense is an aromatic resin used in worship.

This gift was a sign that this child is the Son of God, a child to be adored.

Incense rises easily if the air is still. Our prayers rise easily if there is stillness within. What causes the noise within our soul? What is clamouring for our attention? Perhaps we need to ask the Lord to quiet us down and give us inner peace.

**Gold** is a gift that proclaimed this child deserves the very best. We can apply some of these gifts to us today.

At first we might think, "Well, that leaves me out. I don't have gold." But it's good to recall again these words of St. Augustine "People go abroad to wonder at the heights of the mountains, at the huge waves of the sea, at the long courses of the rivers, at the vast compass of the ocean, at the circular motions of the stars; and they pass by themselves without wondering."

The challenge of this feast is to rediscover the gold that is the beauty of human life, the gold that is our talents and abilities, and the gold that is our faith. Then we can ask the Lord to show us how we can enrich the world with these gifts.

If we, in the spirit of myrrh, bury selfishness, heal hurts, If we, in the spirit of frankincense, spend time in worship,

- If we, in the spirit of gold, share our gifts with all people,
- Then we will be shining stars leading others to Christ.
