## From Father Raining

Sherlock Holmes and his smart assistant Dr. Watson go on a camping trip, enjoy a heavy barbeque dinner with a bottle of whisky, set up their tent, and fall asleep. Some hours later, Holmes wakes his faithful friend. "Watson, look up at the sky and tell me what you see." Watson replies, "I see millions of stars." "What does that tell you?"

Watson ponders for a minute. "Astronomically speaking, it tells me that there are millions of galaxies and potentially billions of planets. Astrologically, it tells me that Saturn is in Leo. Time wise, it appears to be approximately a quarter past three. Theologically, it's evident the Lord is all powerful and we are small and insignificant. Meteorologically, it seems we will have a beautiful day tomorrow. What does it tell you?" Holmes is silent for a moment, then speaks. "Watson, you idiot, someone has stolen our tent."

Watson had missed the most obvious. He was clever enough to notice the complexities of the stars, but he missed what was plain and simple. Today's Gospel reading is about a whole lot of people who miss the point. In Jesus' healing of a blind man, the Pharisees missed the most evident point that it was a real miracle by Divine intervention.

- Second Reading: St. Paul encourages us to learn what is pleasing to the Lord.  
*What can I do today that would be most pleasing to God?*
- Gospel: The blind man learns to recognise Jesus through faith.  
*What most help me to "see" Jesus in a new way today*

### IMPORTANT - CoronaVirus COVID-19 Update

As you are aware, one of the latest requirements necessitates cancelling organised non-essential indoor gatherings of 100 or more. This of course directly impacts on a number of our liturgical celebrations and events.

This is a good measured decision, and be understood as a responsible and precautionary step to protect the most vulnerable amongst us, especially our elderly, the infirm and the very young.

Please take the time to read the following and the changes currently in place:

- Saturday Vigil, Sunday masses to be held in the school playground weather permitting (until further notice)
- Presentation of the Gifts and the Sign of Peace will no longer be part of our liturgy (until further notice)
- The Body of Christ will only be administered in the hand because of high risk from saliva.
- Confessions Saturday afternoon remain unchanged
- Holy Water stoups in the Church have been emptied however Holy Water will continue to be available for people to take home from the large glass dispenser at the back of the Church.
- Do not leave this bulletin behind after Mass and should be taken with you when you leave.
- The faithful who are too unwell to attend Sunday Mass – whether due to coronavirus or some other condition – or are at particular risk of contracting the COVID-19 virus you are dispensed from your Sunday obligation, however, you can participate by either:
  - ~ having a time of prayer within the home
  - ~ reading the Scriptures
  - ~ watching Mass on television channel 10 at 6am Sunday, or
  - ~ viewing Mass online on the internet <http://bit.ly/MassOnDemand>
- Individuals should consider their own health, including any potential to infect others with a contagious disease, before attending a public liturgical celebration.
- We will no longer be asking you to pass the collection plates amongst ourselves as collectors will be at each end of the pew so that you can place any offering in the basket nearest to your side.

### Other changes you need to be aware of:

- Symbolon - postponed until further notice
- Second Rite of Reconciliation (Mon 6th April) - cancelled
- Stations of the Cross (Fridays 7pm) - moved to school playground (weather permitting)
- Easter Ceremonies – still undecided at this early stage and stay tuned.
