From Father Raining

"What is success?" asked Ralph Waldo Emerson. "Success," he said "was to know even one life has breathed easier because you lived. This is to have succeeded."

In poetic language we hear the same definition:

An old man walking a lonesome road, came at the evening, cold and gray,
To a chasm vast and wide and steep, with waters running cold and deep.
The old man crossed in the twilight dim, the rolling stream had no fears for him;
But he turned when safe on the other side, and built a bridge to span the tide.
"Old man," said a fellow traveller near, "you are wasting your strength with building here.
Your journey will end with the passing day, you never again will pass this way.
You've crossed the chasm, deep and wide, why build you this bridge at eventide?
The builder lifted his old gray head, "Good friend, in the path I have come," he said,
"There followeth after me today a youth whose feet must pass this way.
The chasm that was nought to me to that fair-haired youth may a pitfall be.
He too must cross in the twilight dim—Good friend, I am building this bridge for him."

Both definitions of success ring true because both are in close harmony with the definition we have from Jesus in today's Gospel Lesson:

"He who abides in Me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit ... by this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be My disciples" (Jn. 15:5,8).

Then, in the next few verses, Jesus gives us the formula for bearing much fruit -- His success formula: "This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (Jn. 15:12-13).

First Reading: The disciples were afraid of Saul the persecutor and did not trust his "conversion."

What evidence do I trust to accept someone's religious sincerity?


Second Reading: John tells us that genuine love is shown not just in words but in everyday deeds.

Gospel: Jesus tells us that we can only survive if we join ourselves to his life.
