From Father Raining

In a "Kudzu" comic strip, a preacher is greeting his congregation at the door after services. Kudzu (the young man for whom the comic strip is named) is struggling to suppress a yawn as he says, "See you next Sunday, preacher." Then a determined-looking woman steps up. Obviously displeased, she says, "Preacher, as a member of the Worship Committee, I must tell you I was hoping you could excite the congregation with your preaching." To which the preacher replies, "Yes, I said I could excite them—not raise them from the dead!" A young playwright was extremely gratified when an important New York critic attended the opening of his "Off-Broadway" play, however the critic quickly fell asleep and remained in that condition throughout the play. The playwright was heartsick. As soon as the play ended, he dashed down the aisle and said to the critic, "I'm sorry you couldn't stay awake longer. You know how much I wanted your opinion!" The veteran play-goer rubbed his eyes and said, "Young man, sleep is an opinion."

In today's Gospel episode, Jesus is preaching in the synagogue. He soon discovers that there is no need to resurrect this congregation. Sleep is not their opinion. They're excited! So excited, in fact, that they're expressing their opinions out loud. At first they are "amazed" by His words. But as they murmur back and forth, their amazement turns into scepticism.

First Reading: Ezekiel is commanded to prophesy even though his audience will be unreceptive.

What gives me the courage to go on when others are unreceptive to my witness?

Second Reading: Paul learns the hard way that his weakness is a showcase for God's strength.

When have my weakness been an unexpected source of blessing for me and others around me?

Gospel: Jesus' neighbours were unreceptive because they could not see beyond their rigid stereotypes.

How might I be missing what Jesus is calling me to discover?

If the current restrictions **do not end** as scheduled on Friday July 9th

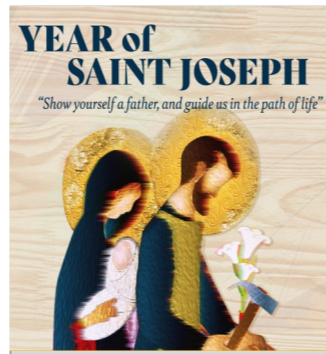
- existing arrangements apply where the Church will remain closed and Masses will be broadcast via our Facebook page.
