From Father Raining

There is a fable of a skylark who came from a noble skylark family. He loved to fly high above the earth and sing beautiful melodies. One thing he didn't like was the daily work of digging worms in order to receive nourishment and stay alive. One day, soaring high above the earth, he saw a little man dressed in a scarlet coat walking down the road hollering "Earth worms for sale. Earth worms traded for skylark feathers." The skylark zoomed down and said to him "What's the deal?" "Two worms for one feather," he answered. "Try it, you'll like it! It's a good deal!" So the skylark tried it and he liked it. He had so many feathers, after all. Who's going to miss one feather? He plucked a feather out, got his worms, and had a lot more time to just coast around that day. Day-after-day the skylark plucked another feather and traded it for worms. Then the awful day came when he tried to fly but was barely able to get himself off the ground and came crashing down again. He realised what had happened. He was a bedraggled skylark, unable to fly.

A contradiction in terms: a skylark that can't fly, so he spent the whole day digging feverishly for worms. When evening came, the little man in the scarlet coat came by. The skylark said to him anxiously, "I've got to trade back." The little man just kept on walking, laughing as he went and shouting over his shoulder, "No deal, friend. Worms for feathers is my business, not feathers for worms." So we go on, day-after day, trading off the bright-coloured feathers of the spirit, avoiding the daily work of our Christian mission, until we reach a point of no return.

We become a contradiction in terms: a Christian without a mission.

First Reading: Amos recounts how God came to him amidst his regular job, commissioning him to witness. *When has God's presence in my regular tasks prompted me to do something new?*

Second Reading: Paul reminds us that God has chosen us, adopted us and lavished many gifts on us. *For which gifts am I especially thankful today?*

Gospel: Jesus commissions the disciples to begin sharing in Christ's work. *To whom is Christ sending me now to bring his healing power?*

Lockdown restrictions are still in place (at this stage) until Friday 16th July.


Existing arrangements continue to apply where the Church will remain closed and Masses will be broadcast via our Facebook page.
