From Father Raning

The story is told of two climbers, Jim and Tom, who had just reached the top of a steep cliff when Jim fell and landed fifty feet below on a narrow ledge. Horrified, Tom yelled down, "Jim, are you okay?" To which Jim yelled back, "I'm alive, but both my arms are broken." "Don't worry, I'll get a rope down to you and pull you up." Tom said. Tom then tossed the rope down to Jim and began pulling him up to safety. Suddenly, Tom remembered Jim had broken both his arms. "If your arms are broken, how are you hanging on to the rope?" he hollered down. Jim yelled back, "With my t-e-e-e-t-h." And down he went!

Living as we do, in this hustle-bustle, complex world of ours, we sometimes feel that, in terms of mere survival, we're holding on by our teeth. Or, in the words of an old Pennsylvania Dutch saying, "The hurrier we go, the behinder we get." And we feel the need to slow down, to back off for a while, to get away from the crowd, to retreat. We feel the need for some guiet time in which to think, maybe even to pray.

In today's Gospel, having been sent out by Jesus in pairs, the Apostles return and report to Him "all that they had done and taught." And Jesus says to them, "Come away by yourselves to a lonely place, and rest awhile." They had been so busy, Mark tells us, that "they had no leisure, even to eat" (Mk. 6:31). In Jesus' opinion they needed a little time to rest and to reflect. And so, "they went away" by boat, "to a lonely place by themselves" (Mk. 6:32).

When our lives tend to become too full and too fast, we have the same need to back off and relax. We need a little solitude in which to think things over. We need a little time to reflect on the meaning of whatever it is we're doing and the direction in which we're going.

First Reading: God's example instructs us that we must have both justice and compassion.

What might I do today to be more just and compassionate toward others?

The Holy Spirit helps us to pray when we don't know how.

For what help with my prayer do I ask the Holy Spirit today?

Gospel: Jesus tells us that God's presence often starts out very small but can grow very large.

Once the restrictions are eventually lifted, we will know more in terms of Mass capacity and if bookings are required, etc and we will provide these updates to our parishioners:


