From Father Raning

There is a story about a man who was on a bus tour of Nashville, Tennessee. The bus driver was pointing out the sights of the Civil War Battle of Nashville.

"Right over there," the driver said, "a small group of Confederate soldiers held off a whole Yankee brigade." A little further along he said, "Over there a young Confederate boy, all by himself, fought off a Yankee platoon." This went on and on until finally, the man taking the tour said, "Didn't the Yankees win anything in the battle of Nashville." The bus-driver replied, "Not while I'm the driver of this bus they didn't."

It is so easy for us to get a Battle of Nashville attitude toward life. We see it only in terms of our narrow prejudice and interests and our family and our personal problems. But when we begin to take seriously the reality that God loves everyone, everywhere in the whole world, that he acted in Jesus Christ to show this love to the whole world, then God can move in our lives and we can get our lives moving.

Second Reading: Paul encourages us to live in love, creating the kind of community that God

Gospel: Many people left Jesus because his message and life-style were too hard.

Feast of St. Bartholomew, Apostle (August 24th)

St. Bartholomew, a doctor in the Jewish law, was a dear friend of St. Philip the Apostle. Because Bartholomew was a man "in whom there was no guile," his mind was open to the truth. He went willingly with Philip to see Christ, and recognised the Saviour immediately as the Son of God. After having received the gifts of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost, Bartholomew evangelized Asia Minor, northwestern India, and Greater Armenia. In the latter country, while preaching to idolaters, he was arrested and condemned to death.

COVID update


