From Father Raning

Have you heard the beautiful children's story about the three trees?

The trees were talking in the forest one day about their dreams for the future.

The first tree said it would like to be made into a cradle, so that it might go on living as a support for the fragile life of a tiny new baby. The second tree wanted to be made into a big ship, so that it might go on living, carrying important cargo and influential people to exotic new lands. The third tree longed to stay right where it was, existing only as a tree, but growing ever taller, and pointing ever higher, to remind everyone that there is a God in heaven who loves them. Those were their dreams: One wanted to be a cradle, one wanted to be a mighty ship. and one wanted to be a tall tree, pointing people toward God.

But then one day woodcutters came and chopped down the three trees...and destroyed their dreams.

The first tree was not made into a cradle, but into a simple feeding trough, a manger for animals. But the manger was sold to a family in Bethlehem, and on the night Jesus was born, that simple feed box became the cradle for the Christ Child.

The second tree was built into a boat, but not the kind it had dreamed of, not a mighty ocean-going vessel but a tiny inexpensive fishing boat. A man named Simon Peter bought the boat, and on one warm afternoon when the crowds pressed in, Jesus himself climbed aboard that small fishing boat that he might preach good news to the multitudes.

The third tree also was deprived of its dream. It wanted to remain standing tall and pointing toward God. Instead, it was cut down and shaped into a horrible instrument of torture. a cross. But it was on that very cross that Jesus was crucified, transforming a symbol of cruelty into a powerful reminder of God's eternal love for all the people.

The three trees were humbled, but in the plan of God, they were exalted.

That's the way it works: When we, in humility, give ourselves to God, our Lord can do great things through us and for us, greater than we can ever imagine.

First Reading: Through suffering, God's servant helps many others.

How has my suffering made me more ready to help others who suffer?

Second Reading: Jesus knows our human weakness.

Which weakness do I want Jesus to help me with today?

Jesus encourages us to become great through serving others.



IMPORTANT: COVID update and when Masses will resume

- In terms of when our Church will reopen for Masses, this is currently scheduled for when the NSW COVID full vaccination rate reaches 80%, and most likely to occur before the end of this month.
- We do not know the date for this and we will immediately update everyone at the same time as announcements during our daily livestreamed Masses and posts on our Parish Facebook page.
- Please remember that you don't actually need to have a Facebook account to access our parish Facebook page.
- We are aware that not all of our parishioners are across these updates. If you know of anyone who does not have internet access, then please continue to reach out to them and keep them informed of the latest news and information.
- · We understand parishioners have questions about returning to attend Mass and this resulted in an increase in enquiries and calls to our Parish Office. We kindly ask for your patience to allow our Parish and Sacramental staff to work closely with our priests to prepare for the reopening of the Church, the progressive reintroduction of Sacraments, etc.
- It would be reasonable to expect when Masses resume, parishioners will be required to sign in, sanitise and wear a mask at all times; capacity limits to numbers attending will apply and bookings will be required for weekend Masses only.
- In saying that, it is anticipated that the 80% fully vaccination rate could be reached by Monday 18th October. On the condition that the Diocesan office has given approval for reopening, then our first weekend masses will take place on 23rd and 24th October. Bookings will be required and made by calling the office on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday only between 9:00am and 1:00pm. Again, we will advise and update our parishioners once this approval has been received.
- Please note there will be only one vigil Mass and at 5:00pm. For the vigil Mass only, if the Church capacity exceeds the limit of 160 then subsequent bookings will be allocated to an additional overflow Mass which will be held in the Parish Centre.
- It is expected Saturday reconciliation will again be available on the Saturday after Masses resumes.
- Bookings are not required for weekday masses.
- The Church will be open for private devotion and general access the same day Masses recommence.
