From Father Raining

Some years ago in a small village, Terri, a little 12 year old girl was babysitting her little brother. Terri walked outside to check the mail and as she turned towards the house she couldn't believe her eyes—the house was on fire. So very quickly the little house was enveloped in flames. Terri ran as fast as she could into the flaming house only to find her baby brother trapped by a burning rafter which had fallen and pinned him to the floor. Hurriedly, Terri worked to free him. She had trouble getting him loose as the flames were dancing around their heads and finally, she freed him. She picked him up, quickly took him out and revived him just as the roof caved in.

By this time, firemen were on the scene and neighbours had gathered outside the smouldering remains of the house. The neighbours had been too frightened to go inside or to do anything to help, and they were tremendously impressed with the courage of the 12 year old girl. They congratulated her for her heroic efforts and said, "Terri, you are so very brave. Weren't you scared? What were you thinking about when you ran into the burning house?" She said, "I wasn't thinking about anything. I just heard my little brother crying."


