

## From Father Raining

A story is told of a very wealthy man who had never been known for his generosity to the church. The church was involved in a big financial program and they resolved to pay him a visit. When the committee met with the man one afternoon, they said that in view of his considerable resources they were sure that he would like to make a substantial contribution to this program.

"I see," he said, "so you have it all figured out have you? In the course of your investigation did you discover that I have a widowed mother who has no other means of support but me?"

No, they responded, they did not know that. "Did you know that I have a sister who was left by a drunken husband with five children and no means to provide for them?" No, they said, we did not.



## The Church is now open—some important updates and reminders

- Effective Monday 8th November, bookings are no longer required for Masses (all existing bookings are no longer valid)
- Upon arrival at the Church you will need to sanitise, QR code or record your details on the sign on sheet and sit according to social distancing requirements.
- Masks are required inside the Church at all times, whether it be for Mass or personal visit.
- The Church is open every day for personal prayer.
- Our Masses will also continue to be livestreamed on Facebook.
- Reconciliation is available and is held on Saturday and be available from 4:00pm to 4:45pm
- There are no entry requirements based upon your vaccination status – the Church is open to everyone.

## November 9th — The Dedication of the (St John) Lateran Basilica in Rome

This basilica is considered the mother church of all Catholic churches in the Western world. It not only gave the Christians of Rome an exclusive place for worship, but architecturally equalled or exceeded all monuments previously raised to pagan gods. This was a momentous period not only in Rome but in both the history of the world and history of Christianity. In 1726, Pope Benedict XIII ordered a worldwide commemoration of the basilica as a sign of universal Catholic unity. This was to encourage Catholics to keep strong ties to our past and to the universal Catholic Church. What joy early Christians must have experienced in this newfound freedom and joining together in their own house of worship which some claim held 10,000 people. This feast reminds us of our Catholic heritage, the significant role the dedication of the Lateran Basilica played in that heritage and the courage of those first followers of Christ and the importance of uniting ourselves to the Holy See. As the Pope is our universal pastor, the Lateran is our universal church.
