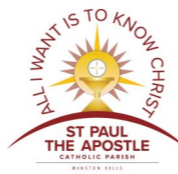

## From Father Raining

In Frankfort, Kentucky (USA) it is said the city was enthralled in a big debate many years ago about placing a water fountain in a public square. The argument became heated in the legislature and at the governor's mansion. Finally, a decision was made to ask three contractors to bid on the project.

The first contractor to bid was from Western Kentucky and said \$3,000. When asked to break it down, he replied, "\$1,000 for labour, \$1,000 for materials, and \$1,000 for me."

The next contractor was from Eastern Kentucky and when asked to give his bid and to break it down he said, "\$6,000. \$2,000 for labor, \$2,000 for materials, and \$2,000 for me."

The last contractor was an established contractor from Frankfort who usually got all of the bids for the capital. When asked to give his bid, he replied, "\$9,000." When asked to break it down, he closed the doors, looked around cautiously, and said, "\$3,000 for YOU, \$3,000 for me, and we give the bid to the guy from Western Kentucky!"

So often we can get side tracked by things that seem important, like water fountains. The disciples were more concerned with the temple being destroyed and the world coming to an end than they were with the things that matter most in life: character, integrity, compassion, and preparedness for Christ's return. This is what Jesus means when he tells his Disciples to watch!

First Reading: God will reward those who "lead many to justice."  
*What might I do this week to help bring justice to some oppressive situation?*

Second Reading: Jesus' self-sacrifice took away our sins, that is, it put us into the right relationship with God and others.  
*What in my relationships with God and others need my attention most today?*

Gospel: Jesus prepares us for meeting God and the judgment that will happen.  
*What might I be most worried about if I faced God's judgment today? Why?*

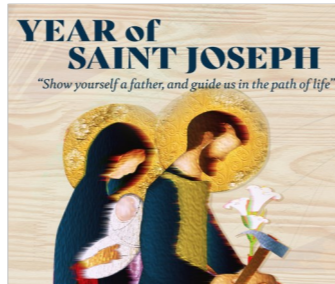
## Invitations are open to join the Diocesan Pastoral Council

## Message of his Holiness Pope Francis for the Fifth World Day of the Poor (November 14)

"The poor you will always have with you" (Mk 14:7) It is my hope that the celebration of the World Day of the Poor, now in its fifth year, will grow in our local Churches and inspire a movement of evangelisation that meets the poor personally wherever they may be. We cannot wait for the poor to knock on our door; we need urgently to reach them in their homes, in hospitals and nursing homes, on the streets and in the dark corners where they sometimes hide, in shelters and reception centres. It is important to understand how they feel, what they are experiencing and what their hearts desire. The poor are present in our midst. How evangelical it would be if we could say with all truth: we too are poor, because only in this way will we truly be able to recognize them, to make them part of our lives and an instrument of our salvation. ## November 18th — Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul

This feast celebrates the dedications of two of the four major basilicas of Rome.

Saint Peter's Basilica was originally built in 323 by the emperor Constantine and constructed over the tomb of Peter the Apostle, the Church's first Pope. After standing for more than a thousand years, Pope Julius II ordered the building to be torn down due to structural concerns. The construction of the new church spanned over 200 years before its completion and dedicated on November 18th, 1626. It is considered the most famous church in Christendom.

Saint Paul's Basilica is located outside the original walls of Rome. It was also originally built by emperor Constantine though destroyed by fire in 1823. Donations from around the world made the reconstruction possible. Before the completion of Saint Peter's Basilica, St Paul's was the largest church in Rome. The Basilica was built over St. Paul's grave. Pope Pius IX consecrated the Basilica in 1854.
