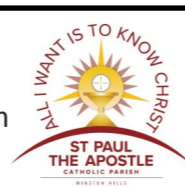

From Father Raining

When a large ship enters a harbour, it takes on board what is called a harbour master. This is a man who knows that harbour; he knows the length of it, he knows the depth of it. He knows where the hazards are. He knows where the tides and currents are; what direction they flow in and how strong they are.

When that harbour master comes on board, he takes control of that ship, and he gives order to the captain who steers the ship. He is an outside expert who is brought in to make sure that ship docks safely.

As we sail through the sea of life, we have been given a harbour master. He is the Holy Spirit.

He knows the currents, tides, hazards, and flow. If you will let Him guide the ship of your life, guide you safely through the hazards of earth, right into the harbour of heaven. Because He is the only guide you need.

C. S. Lewis once said the most frequently spoken word in heaven would be, "OH." As in, "Oh, now I understand." Or, "Oh, now I see what God's plan was." Or, "Oh, now I see the reason for the trial I went through."

We do not have that luxury in this world. We walk by faith, not by knowledge. But one day it will be revealed to us. We will be in the presence of the Father and the Son and the Spirit. How can we be in the presence of all three at the same time? But as St. Paul says, "I know whom I have believed and I am persuaded that He is able to guard until that Day what has been entrusted to me."

First Reading: Wisdom infused God's creative work.

Which wonders of creation inspire me to marvel and praise God the Creator?

Second Reading: Paul even boasts of his afflictions because they build character and reveal God's love.

What hardships have revealed God's love for me?

Gospel: The Holy Spirit will guide us to all truth.

With what difficulties do I most need the Spirit's guidance today?

Feast Day: Saint Anthony of Padua (June 13th)

Was canonized less than one year after dying aged 35. Upon exhumation 336 years later, his body was found to be corrupted, yet his tongue was totally incorrupt, so perfect were the teachings that had been formed upon it. He is typically depicted with a book and the Infant Child Jesus, referred today as the finder of lost articles credited with miracles involving lost people, things and lost spiritual goods.
