

From Father Raining

A time management guru, a professor in the business school at Harvard, speaks about A, B, and C priorities, and then he notes that too many people spend too much of their time on the C priorities!

And then he asks, "Why do you think that is?" The answer is that the C priorities are much easier to accomplish and give you the impression that you are actually getting something done.

In other words you can keep busy with the C priorities all day and never get to the more important things.

The lesson from Mary and Martha is:

"Don't let the good (the C priorities) get in the way of the best (the A priorities).

Sisters of Saint Joseph celebrate 150 years

The Sisters of Saint Joseph celebrate 150 years of the Congregation's presence in NSW.

The Congregation was founded by Mary MacKillop and Father Julian Tenison Woods in 1866 in South Australia, and six years after their founding the first foundation of the Sisters of Saint Joseph in NSW was created in Queen Charlotte Vale, now Perthville, on 16 July 1872.

From this small beginning the ministry of the Sisters grew and expanded into all 11 Dioceses in NSW.

Throughout the journey of these past 150 years, with all its twists and turns, ups and downs, the grace of God has continued to meet the needs of the times through the ministry of the sisters.

The feast of St. Mary Magdalene is considered one of the most mystical of feasts, and it is said that of all the songs of the saints, that of Mary Magdalene is the sweetest and strongest because her love was so great. That love was praised by Jesus Himself who said that because much was forgiven her, she loved much. She was known to be a "great sinner," a woman of the streets who heard Jesus speak of the mercy and forgiveness of God and changed her life completely. She has always been the example of great love and great forgiveness, one of those close to Jesus who grasped the truth of God's love for human beings and spent her life bearing witness to that love. She was the first recorded witness to the resurrection of Jesus, His most ardent and loving follower. She had stood with Mary at the foot of the Cross on that brutal Good Friday afternoon and had been by the side of Mary during these difficult hours. Her matter-of-fact witness to the Resurrection moved Peter and John to go and see for themselves: "I have seen the Lord and these things he said to me." Jesus had chosen her to bring the news to them and she simply told them what had happened.
