
Christ the King, North Rocks - Parish Golden Jubilee Celebrations: 19th November

Christ the King Parish will be celebrating its 50th anniversary with Mass presided by Bishop Vincent 5.30pm Saturday 19th November, the Feast of Christ the King. All are welcome to celebrate this significant parish milestone, with former parishioners particularly invited to the celebration. Feast Days this week

<u>26th</u> Saints Cosmas and Damian: Arab twins who studied medicine and practiced as doctors in Syria. They charged no fee for their services and referred to as 'the silverless', and attracted many to Christianity. Around 303 AD during persecutions, were ordered to recant their faith but refused. They were beheaded and died as martyrs for their faith in Jesus Christ together with their three brothers. 27th Saint Vincent de Paul: As chaplain to a poor parish, and to galley prisoners, inspired him to a vocation of working with those most marginalised and powerless. He urged his followers to bring God's justice and love to people unable to live a full human life: "Deal with the most urgent needs. Organise charity so that it is more efficient...teach reading and writing, educate with the aim of giving each the means of self-support. Intervene with authorities to obtain reforms in structure... there is no charity without justice." 28th Saint Wenceslaus, Saint Lawrence Ruiz and Companions

<u>29th</u> Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael: "Angel" means servant/messenger of God and distinct from saints, which men can become. Angels are immortal and have intellect and will. Archangels are one of the nine choirs of angels. In ascending order, the choirs or classes are 1) Angels, 2) Archangels, 3) Principalities, 4) Powers, 5) Virtues, 6) Dominations, 7) Thrones, 8) Cherubim, and 9) Seraphim. Each archangels performs a different mission: Michael protects; Gabriel announces; Raphael guides. <u>30th</u> Saint Jerome: wrote extensively for 34 years. He defended the divinity of the Blessed Virgin Mary and battled several heresies. Jerome corrected the Vetus Latina (existing Latin-language version of New Testament) and translated Hebrew Bible from original Hebrew and Old Latin. St Jerome comes second after Augustine of Hippo as the second most voluminous writer in ancient Latin Christianity. 1st Saint Théresè of the Child Jesus: offered herself as a sacrificial victim to the merciful Love of God on June 9, 1895, the feast of the Most Holy Trinity and the following year, on the night between Holy Thursday and Good Friday, she noticed the first symptoms of Tuberculosis, the illness which would lead to her death. There is recognised in her illness the mysterious visitation of the divine Spouse and welcomed the suffering as an answer to her offering the previous year. She also began to undergo a terrible trial of faith which lasted until her death a year and a half later. "Her last words, 'My God, I love you,' are the seal of her life," said Pope John Paul II and was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II in 1997 - 100 years after her death at the age of 24. She is only the third woman to be so proclaimed, after Saint Catherine of Siena and Saint Teresa of Avila.
