## From Father Raining

Daniel Defoe gave us some good advice through his fictitious character Robinson Crusoe. The first thing that Crusoe did when he found himself on a deserted island was to make out a list. On one side of the list he wrote down all his problems. On the other side he listed down all of his blessings. On one side wrote: I do not have any clothes. On the other side: But it's warm and I don't really need any. On one side wrote: All provisions were lost. On the other: But there's plenty of fresh fruit and water on the island. And on down the list he went. In this fashion he discovered that for every negative aspect about his situation, there was a positive aspect, something to be thankful for. It is easy to find ourselves on an island of despair. Perhaps it is time that we sit down and take an inventory of our blessings. Maybe, there are some of us that are long, long overdue in expressing our thanks to God.

First Reading: The foreigner Naaman tries to find a way to give thanks to God for his healing.  
*What can I do today to show my thanks to God?*

Second Reading: Paul claims that God's word is not chained but powerful.  
*What can I do to allow God's word to change my actions to become more like Jesus?*

Gospel: Jesus wonders why those healed do not express thanks.  
*When have I failed to express my thanks for what God has done for me?*

The Cenacle is a small faith-sharing group and is as old as the Church itself. The format followed is where small groups gather to learn and share their faith. In her messages, Our Lady insistently calls upon priests, religious and faithful to gather together with her in fervent prayer and fraternal love, in authentic cenacles as when the first apostles gathered with her in the Upper Room in Jerusalem awaiting the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. "Just as in the Cenacle of Jerusalem the Apostles, reunited with me in prayer, prepared for the moment of the first Pentecost, so also, in the cenacle of my Immaculate Heart – and consequently in the cenacles where you are gathered in prayer – you apostles of these last times can, with your heavenly Mother, obtain a new effusion of the Holy Spirit."

The Cenacle is held in the Marian Chapel every Thursday morning following Mass. You are invited to join us every Thursday or whichever Thursday suits you.
