Update on our Clergy

In wonderful and welcome news, Father Abraham Kunnatholy will be joining our parish on a permanent basis. Father Abraham (who belongs to the congregation of Carmelites of Mary Immaculate) most recently served since 2020 in the Blue Mountains after time spent in Victoria. We will share more on Father Abraham closer to the time he commences his appointment here at St Paul's in mid April. In the meantime Father Philip will continue to share in celebrating our weekend Masses.

Saint Patrick's Day - 17th March

Saint Patrick was sent to take the Gospel to Ireland. where he converted many people and entire kingdoms and began building churches across the country. He often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and preached for 40 years and converted all of Ireland. He worked many miracles and wrote of his love for God in Confessions. After years of living in poverty, traveling and enduring much suffering he died March 17, 461 at Saul, where he had built the first Irish church. It wasn't until the 1630s that 17 March, the traditional day of his death, was added to the Catholic breviary (a book of prayers) as the Feast of St Patrick. Breastplate of Saint Patrick (shortened version):

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down, Christ when I arise, Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me, Christ in every eye that sees me, Christ in every ear that hears me.
