# **From Father Raning**

In his book Directions, author James Hamilton shares this insight about listening to God: "Before refrigerators, people used icehouses to preserve their food. Icehouses had thick walls, no windows, and a tightly fitted door. In winter, when streams and lakes were frozen, large blocks of ice were cut, hauled to the icehouses, and covered with sawdust. Often the ice would last well into summer.

A man lost a valuable watch while working in an icehouse. He searched diligently for it, carefully raking through the sawdust, but didn't find it. His fellow workers also looked, but their efforts, too, proved futile. A small boy who heard about the fruitless search slipped into the icehouse during the noon hour and soon emerged with the watch. Amazed, the men asked him how he found it.

"I closed the door," the boy replied, "lay in the sawdust, and kept still. Soon I heard the watch ticking."

Often the question is not whether God is speaking, but whether we are being still enough, and quiet enough, to hear. Yes, Jesus assures us that our heavenly Father always listens to us, but do we really listen to God? Do we follow the instructions of Psalm 46, "Be still, and know that I am God"?

First Reading: God looks into the heart of each person.

How can I get beyond appearances when dealing with others?

Second Reading: Paul encourages us to learn what is pleasing to the Lord.

What can I do today that would be most pleasing to God?

Gospel: The blind man learns to recognize Jesus through faith.

What would most help me to "see" Jesus in a new way today?

#### Novena to St Pedro Calungsod in our Parish

Everyone is welcome to attend a special Novena Mass here at St Pauls at 7:30pm Friday 24th March. It is one of nine Masses being celebrated across the Diocese in honour of St Pedro Calungsod. Calungsod died at only 17 years of age and was canonized in 2012. He is the second Filipino to be declared a saint by the Roman Catholic Church. At his canonization Mass, Calungsod was the only saint without a first class relic exposed for veneration, as his body had been thrown into the sea and lost. # Feast of Saint Joseph - 20<sup>th</sup> March (for 2023)

Joseph is also patron saint of the Universal Church, families, fathers, pregnant women, travelers, immigrants, house sellers and buyers, craftsmen, engineers, and working people in general. We celebrate two feast days for Joseph: March 19 for Joseph the Husband of Mary, and May 1 for Joseph the Worker. March 19 is the most commonly celebrated feast day for Joseph, and it wasn't until 1955 that Pope Pius XII established the Feast of "St. Joseph the Worker" to be celebrated on May 1.
