From Father Raning

An old fable tells of the colt that carried Jesus on Palm Sunday. The donkey got up next morning, his mind still savouring the afterglow of the most exciting day of his life. Never before had he felt such a rush of pleasure and pride. He walked into town and found a group of people by the well. "I'll show myself to them," he thought. But they didn't notice him. They went on drawing water and paid him no heed. "Throw your garments down," he said crossly. "Don't you know who I am?" They just looked at him in amazement. Someone slapped him across the tail and ordered him to move. "Miserable heathens!" he muttered to himself. "I'll just go to the market where people will remember me." But the same thing happened. No one paid any attention to him as he strutted down the main street. Where are the palm branches!" he shouted. "Yesterday, you threw palm branches!"

The people beat him and drove him away. Hurt and confused, the donkey returned home to his mother. "Foolish child," she said gently. "Don't you realise that without Him, you are just an ordinary donkey?" Just like the donkey that carried Jesus to Jerusalem, we are only fulfilled when we are in the service of Jesus Christ. Without him, all our best efforts are like "filthy rags" (Isaiah 64:6). When we serve Christ, however, we are no longer ordinary people, but key players in God's plan to redeem the word.

You are invited: Liturgy of the Hours

The Liturgy of the Hours (Divine Office) are a set of Catholic prayers and forms the official set of prayers marking the hours of each day and sanctifying the day with prayer. Within the Latin Church, the lay faithful "are encouraged to recite the divine office, either with the priests, or among themselves, or even individually" and may oblige themselves to pray the Liturgy of the Hours or part of it by a personal vow. Liturgy of the Hours are held in our parish only during Holy Week and no other time of the year. Please join us at 9:00am on Good Friday or 9:00am on Holy Saturday (noting there is no actual mass).

Divine Mercy Novena

This is held every year and takes place in the Marian Chapel immediately after the Lord's Passion this Friday April 7th... The Novena is prayed at 3:30pm daily until Saturday April 15th, in preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday on April 16th.
