Update on Clergy in our Parish

Our Parish extends a special and warm welcome to Father (Doctor) Abraham Kunnatholy who commences his appointment here at St Paul the Apostle this week. Father Abraham replaces Father Marcus as Assistant Priest. In terms of some background. Father Abraham is an Indian priest belonging to the congregation of Carmelites of Mary Immaculate and ordained in 1996. He has also written many articles and has authored three books, including a study of history of Christianity in India, with emphasis on St. Thomas Christians in Madhya Pradesh. He has been serving in the Diocese of Parramatta since moving to Australia in late 2014.

We say thank you and farewell to Father Philip Alesin, who has been generously assisting at our weekend Masses over recent weeks. Father Philip provided much needed clergy support in the period between Father Marcus relocating and Father Abraham commencing.

Our Parish Priest Father Raning, as he recently shared with our parishioners, will be relocating to Saint Matthew's Parish in Windsor. As part of the process, the position of Parish Priest here at Winston Hills will be advertised, and until a replacement has been found. Father Raning will remain here. The overall timing of the process is unknown and we will keep everyone updated as more is known.

In terms of an opportunity for our Parish to officially farewell Father Raning (and also belatedly for Father Marcus), this will be held as part of our Parish Feast Day celebrations on the morning of Sunday June 25th.

Divine Mercy Sunday this weekend

The rays of blood and water flowing from the Saviour's pierced Heart and the wounds on His hands and feet recall the events of Good Friday. Saint Faustina's Diary (Divine Mercy in My Soul), contains many passages in which Our Lord is guoted as requesting that a "Feast of Mercy" be officially established. At the canonisation of Saint Faustina, Pope John Paul II announced "It is important that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter (first Sunday after Easter), which from now on throughout the Church will be called 'Divine Mercy Sunday'."
