Message from our Priest Parish Secretary (after six years I can finally get a word in!) Greeting fellow parishioners,

I am honoured to write this week's message, and doing so as part of Father John Pauls' initiative for our bulletin to include messages from various members of our parish community, and not just our clergy. As parish secretary. I follow in the footsteps of those beautiful and caring secretaries before me such as

Nancy, Mary and others, who are the welcoming and warm smile when you visit, and when you phone are the reassuring voice that whatever you need will be attended to. Someone once told me the role is Martha and Mary combined, ie listen like Mary and have Martha's hospitality. No easy feat but so true. As much as the role is to support our ongoing operations, we are often the entry point into the parish, and even the Catholic Church, and these first impressions through the encounter with the parish secretary can be critical.
