Message from our priest

Though Catholic Church is said to be one, holy, apostolic, and universal, it has different liturgical families within the communion of the Catholic Church. They are coming from six different families of rites spread among the *sui iuri*s churches of Catholic communion. They are, broadly: we can say, the western rites (Latin rites) and the eastern rites. Western rites include Roman rite (ordinary and extra ordinary) Gallican rites (Ambrosian rite of Italy, Braga rite of Portugal), Catholic Order rites (Benedictine and Carmelite Rites of a few communities) and Eastern rites have liturgical rites of all 23 churches which are in communion with Rome.

Eastern Catholic churches include the Coptic Catholic Church, Eritrean Catholic Church, Ethiopian Catholic Church, Maronite Church, Syrian Catholic Church, Syro Malankara Church, Armenian Catholic Church, Chaldean Catholic Church, Syro_Malabar Church, Albanian Catholic Church, Belarusian Catholic Church, Croatian Byzantian Catholic Church or Croatian Greek Catholic Church, Greek Catholic Church, Hungarian Catholic Church, Italo-Albanian Catholic Church, Macedonian Catholic Church, Melkite Greek Catholic Church, Romanian Church united with Rome, Russian Catholic Church, Slovak Catholic Church, Ukranian Greek Catholic Church.

Church, according to canon law (27), is said to be a group of Christian faithful united by a hierarchy according to certain norms of law which was expressly or tacitly recognised by the supreme authority of the church. Rite reflects ritual traditions and church customs. All rites in the Catholic Church have equal rights and dignity. In liturgy there are immutable parts and parts that can be changed by the church. Immutable parts will remain the same for all churches, but the parts that can be changed can be altered by the *sui iuris* or autonomous churches incorporating the local customs and traditions (CCC1203-1206).

Diversity in the churches does not mean that it affects the unity of the church. Church remains united in her basic profession of faith and proclamation. All Catholic churches accept the primacy of the Pope and thereby remain united under one authority. The Pope's decision is binding for all Catholic churches concerning the teachings of faith and morals of the church. All the churches had their origin in Jerusalem and from there apostles moved in different directions to different parts of the world and so we have a "Church of Churches" or communion of the Catholic Church.
