There is nothing Ordinary about Ordinary Time !

Today in the Church's liturgical calendar we celebrate the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. You may also be asking yourself why isn't there a first Sunday of Ordinary Time? Because there isn't! Last Sunday, being Epiphany Sunday, is not part of Ordinary Time as it is officially part of Christmastime. Normally, what would have been the first Sunday of Ordinary Time, is actually the Baptism of the Lord, which was celebrated last Monday 8th January.

It is also important to recognise that Sunday (and not Monday) is the first day of a liturgical week. When we offer the prayers of a weekday in ordinary time, assuming there is no particular feast that day, we use prayers from the Sunday before. So to call the Sunday, that we call the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time, Fridays 3:30pm in Marian Chapel the First Sunday, would be to look backwards and not forward in the week, which is not the way we view liturgical time. So in the Roman Missal, prayers for those days are listed under "First Week of Ordinary Time," while the prayers for every future week fall under the relevant "Sunday of Ordinary Time" for that week.

Ordinary Time is a season encompassing the majority of the liturgical calendar, lasting for 33 or 34 weeks. The season is divided into two parts: one between the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and Ash Wednesday, and the other between Pentecost and Advent. This division reflects the unfolding of Jesus' life and ministry. with the first part focusing on his early years and the second part on his public ministry.

The term "Ordinary Time" does not imply that these Sundays are ordinary or unimportant; rather, the word "ordinary" is derived from the Latin word "ordinalis," meaning "numbered."

Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time are days of growth and harvest -- days of hope and time to mature in one's faith. Green is the colour of ongoing life in nature: the renewal of spring grass, flowers and trees. Green signifies hope and growth, inviting us to journey deeper into the heart of our relationship with God.
