#### Come and join our Parish Sacramental Team

We are in need of additional members to join our Sacramental team.

The sacramental team members, who are volunteers, take on the role of preparing the children for the sacraments by facilitating the formation meetings for the following sacraments:

First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation

The team is made up of committed Catholics who prepare children for the Sacraments. The children are part of the Parish community and attend St Paul the Apostle school and several other schools.

Preparing the children for the sacraments is family centred, parish based and school supported. The Sacramental team build on the religious education of the children and share in the joy of walking beside the children on their faith journey.

There are two formation meetings for each of the sacraments and depending on the sacrament, a practice session might also be required.

The formation meetings and practice meetings generally take place on a Sunday afternoon in the Church and go for approximately one hour. The children attend the meetings with a parent.

Parents are given guidelines on what is covered in the formation meetings and each child receives a workbook to complete before they attend the meeting.

Sacramental team members receive all the resources and in addition guidelines to follow at the formation meeting.

Team members are provided with a calendar of dates for each of the sacraments and are asked to indicate their availability to assist at the following:

formation meetings, practice meeting (if one is required), and the actual Sacrament.

The formation meetings open and close with a prayer. Parents can ask questions and then the children and their parent are placed in smaller groups with a team member and the meeting begins.

The tremendous support of our parishioners who generously provide of their time and of themselves as part of this team, is pivotal and fundamental to ensuring our parish children are supported and prepared. If we do not have a sufficient number of Sacramental team members, this compromises our ability as a parish to deliver the necessary level of support for the children on their Sacramental journey.

Please give some prayerful thought to joining this team. The more members we have will reduce the load for all members.

#### Stations of the Cross

Please come and join us for Stations of the Cross which will be held every Friday evening during Lent commencing at 7:00pm. It is also known as Way of the Cross, Via Crucis, Via Dolorosa (Latin for Way of Sorrows), is a devotion that reflects on Jesus' final days on Earth. It developed when knights and pilgrims began to follow the route of Christ's way to Calvary, and spread throughout Europe, promulgated by the Franciscan friars from the 14th century. It became an important catechetical tool and this devotion is to "walk" in Jesus' shoes by praying and meditating on each of the events Jesus experienced; it's often said that you must walk a mile in someone's shoes to understand what they are going through. The practice of artistic renderings of the Stations in churches didn't begin until around 1686, when Pope Innocent XI allowed Franciscan friars to adorn their churches with the different stations. Pope Benedict XIII extended that privilege to all the faithful in 1726. In 1731, Pope Clement XII allowed all churches to have stations and fixed the number at 14.
