Lenten Observance in Different Catholic Churches

Lent is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's resurrection.

It's also a time where we remember the Lord's 40 days fasting in the desert.

Moses in the Old Testament also spent 40 days and nights on Mount Sinai in prayer before he received the ten commandments from Yahweh.

During lent we seek the Lord in prayer, fasting, giving alms, penance, and self-control.

Lent is observed throughout the Catholic churches but with minor or major differences in rituals and ceremonies.

Lent in the Roman Catholic Church begins Ash Wednesday and runs up to Holy Thursday evening. Sundays in Latin Rite are excluded from Lenten observance and thus, making it 40 days of Lenten fasting.

The Eastern Catholics start the Lenten observance on Ash Monday two days prior to Ash Wednesday. However, some Eastern Churches have 40 days of great fasting until Monday of Holy Week, ie the day after Easter Sunday. Syro-Malabar Church, one of the Eastern Churches, have 50 days of fasting starting from Monday before Ash Wednesday until Easter Sunday.

Lent is also a special time for the candidates who are preparing to receive the sacrament of Baptism. It is also a time of penance and of various pious practices in all the churches. They include personal and communitarian Way of the Cross, Lenten retreats or reflections, personal sacrifices, and penances of different sorts.

In early centuries the rules regarding fasting in all the Churches were very strict, however in more recent times there are somewhat less strict fasting rules in most of the Churches. The Eastern Rite Christians have comparatively stricter rules about fasting, and even in their case, it is not as strict as it used to be in early centuries.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) update

RCIA is the process through which older children and adults are prepared for entry into the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation. This marks the end of a lengthy period of preparation for the Catechumens, three of whom are from our parish: Li, Shontay and Tan. During the Rites, they publicly acknowledge their desire to receive the Sacraments of Initiation, and their desire to be received into full Communion with the Catholic Church on Easter Saturday. The Rites mark the beginning of a period of more intense preparation and are asked to follow Christ with greater generosity of spirit.
