Did you know the Diocese of Parramatta has it's own Seminary? The Holy Spirit Seminary located in Harris Park was established in 2013 and supports the formation of our seminarians in their journey of personal transformation, committed to meeting the spiritual and pastoral needs of our community. With a strong emphasis on brotherhood, the seminary takes as its model the group of disciples gathered around Jesus to learn from him the gracious plan of the Father for the world. In learning to be more like Christ, the seminarian as disciple is preparing to become an apostle to live out that mission as a priest, to gather together and care for the flock of Christ. It also takes at least seven years of intense study, vocational preparation, and guidance for God's ministry.

This Sunday, April 21st, is Good Shepherd Sunday and World Prayer for Vocations Day.

This is also why the annual Parramatta Catholic Foundation's Bishop's Good Shepherd Appeal is held at this time. Our Parish is proud to support this appeal and your generosity will enable our Holy Spirit seminarians to remain actively present in our community, ministering to their flocks and helping people nurture their faith and live a Christian life.
