- 3:30pm Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be sung in the church in front of the Blessed Sacrament (feel free to assemble at 3:00pm)
- 6:00pm Evening Prayer/Vespers will be held. This is also known as Liturgy Of The Hours.
- 6.00pm Reconciliation until 7:00pm

- Solemnity of All Saints Friday, 1st November: 9:10am Mass; preceded by Rosary at 8:40am.
- All Souls Day (Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed) Saturday, 2nd November: 9:10am Mass; preceded by Rosary at 8:40am. The Vigil Mass on Saturday 5pm will be the Mass of 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time and not All Souls Day.

Please note that in addition to all the Sundays in the year, the only feast days to be observed in Australia as Holy Days of Obligation are: the solemnities of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ (December 25th) and the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (August 15th).

November Scroll and Month Of The Holy Souls

November is dedicated to the Holy Souls and the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life, but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope...For the Lord Himself shall come down from heaven...and the dead who are in Christ shall rise." The November Scroll for the Holy Souls is placed on the Altar as has been our custom. All Masses offered in November will be for the souls named on the scroll. If you would like to include your deceased family members and friends, please use the November envelopes which you will find at the back of the Church. These may be placed in either of the collection plates at weekend masses.
