## Second week of Advent: Peace

The second candle on the Advent Wreath is called the Bethlehem candle. It is a symbol of the preparations being made to receive and cradle the Christ child. It is also called The Candle of Peace. We hear from Isaiah of one who will be born Prince of Peace.

It symbolises faith and a reminder of the experience of Joseph and Mary in the city of Bethlehem. A symbol of the preparations being made to receive and cradle the Christ child.

## What is the Jesse tree?

The Jesse tree is named from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out of the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of King David. Originally, the Jesse tree illustrates Jesus' human royal lineage, from King David down to Mary. We adorn a Jesse tree with ornaments that represent the people, prophesies, and events leading up to the birth of Jesus. Decorating the Jesse Tree in Advent teaches some important lessons. When we contemplate the Jesse tree we realise ever more deeply the intimate relationship between God and our own humanity. It helps us to connect with the humanity of Jesus, who, like us, came from a family line that was in many ways imperfect.
