# January 1<sup>st</sup>: Solemnity Of Mary, The Holy Mother Of God

The Solemnity Of Mary is one of the most important days of the Church calendar, however it is not a Holy Day of Obligation. The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference decreed (unchanged since 2001) the only feast days to be observed as holy days of obligation are Christmas Day, Feast of the Assumption and all Sundays. Holy Mass will be held Wednesday, 1st January at 9:10am.

## **Morning Holy Rosary**

The Rosary is prayed at 8.40am before each weekday Mass.

### Wednesday Novena to our Mother of Perpetual Help

Novena is prayed at the end of Mass on Wednesday mornings. Mary is "our Mother on the order of grace," and all the graces Mary gives us come directly from our Lord. She is always ready to intercede with Him on our behalf, but never for anything contrary to His wishes.

### **Thursday Cenacles**

Our Lady insistently calls upon us to gather with her in fervent prayer, in authentic cenacles as when the first apostles gathered with her in the Upper Room awaiting the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. This prayer group is held in Marian Chapel after Thursday morning Mass. **Divine Mercy Chaplet** 

The Chaplet is a devotion that implores the Father's mercy by invoking the merits Jesus has won for us through his redemptive Sacrifice of Calvary. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is typically prayed using Catholic rosary beads. Held every Friday at 3:30pm in Marian Chapel.

# Liturgy of the Hours

This is the daily prayer of the Church and a meditative dialogue on the mystery of Christ. It is the very prayer which Christ himself together with his Body addresses to the Father, and integrate the prayers of the psalms. Held on the first Friday of the month at 6:00pm.

### **Eucharistic Adoration**

Eucharistic Adoration is a pious custom in the Church since time immemorial. We adore God when we worship Him in His Real Presence in the Eucharist, and being there in Adoration is a powerful and personal time to be in His presence. Come... spend some time with Him. • 24 hour Adoration is held every first Friday commencing with 9:10am Mass Friday . First Adoration in 2025 is Friday 7th February. • Thursday Adoration is held every Thursday at 6:00pm for one hour, followed by Mass at 7:00pm.
