Epiphany of Christ

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

Epiphany of Christ invites us to reflect on the revelation of Jesus Christ to the world, to the gentiles and to everyone. Christ came not Just as the saviour of Israelites alone, but of the gentiles as well. If Christ came as the saviour of everyone then how epiphany is going to affect me and you? It invites and challenges us to broaden our world vision. The narrow-minded thinking of me and mine has no place in the life of Christians. They should have the generosity to include everyone into their world. No one is discarded or sidelined. It's an "all inclusive" world vision to which we are called. This will ask us to be open to God's word in our being and doing.

This is better said than done. Let us ask ourselves? Do we have this generous "all inclusive" approach in our lives. We may say we do not have any problem with anyone, but the question is: am I ready to include others who are not familiar to us or hold different views in their lives into my circles and discussions.

This question will lead me to more complicated questions.

"Should I lose my identity as a Christian to include others into my circle?

The answer again is a challenging one. Not an easy task.

This broadening of minds to an "all inclusive attitude" does not mean that Christians should be generous enough to accommodate sin and evil into their lives. Here again the model is Jesus our master. He loved sinners not sin. He told all those sinners who came to him, "Sin no more" This and only this, is the criterion that Jesus gives us too; include everyone but not the sinful ways of those who may differ in their being and thinking, into our lives.

As disciples of the Lord, we are called not to identify ourselves with the world, but to identify ourselves with the Lord and transform this world according to the mind of Jesus. This is the challenging task that the Epiphany of the Lord places before us. Let us manifest Jesus and his teachings in and through our lives and show that we are Christians who are completely committed to the Lord.

Parish Safeguarding Compliance and Renewal Training

Mandatory Safeguarding Compliance Training is compulsory for all staff, volunteers and ministers in the Diocese of Parramatta. The initial training is known as Compliance Training and requires the successful completion of compulsory Modules 1,2 and 3.

- Module 1: Understanding Safeguarding and the Child Safe Standards
- Module 2: Legal Compliance, ROSH (Risk Of Significant Harm) and RC (Reportable Conduct)
- Module 3: Working with Adults at Risk and Understanding Boundaries

After a two year period, there are two further modules (known as Renewal Compliance Training) that are required to be completed.

- Module 4: Understanding Safeguarding, the Child Safe Standards & Working with Adults at Risk
- Module 5: Legal Compliance: Risk Of Significant Harm & Reportable Conduct

If it has been two years since you have completed Modules 1, 2 and 3, and you have not undertaken or completed Modules 4 and 5, you can complete this training online at home, or as part of a face to face group. Please refer to the details below for training options. The next round of face-to-face training will be held at St Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church, 40 Breakfast Road, Marayong.
