Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Happy feast day of the Baptism of the Lord!

We liturgically conclude the Christmas season with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. As we celebrate this feast, we may also remind ourselves of our own baptism. The day of our baptism is indeed an important day as "through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as children of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1213).

All the baptised members of the Church are called to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ in our homes, workplaces, community and throughout the whole world.

I wish to share with you that I am accompanying 11 young adults from our parish and from other parishes in our Diocese to Cebu and Manila, Philippines from January 20 to February 04. What is this Sacrament called?

Especially as we celebrate this special Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, it is important to consider and appreciate the origins of how the Sacrament of Baptism was named. The following three paragraphs from the Catechism of the Catholic Church provide this detail:

- 1214 This sacrament is called Baptism, after the central rite by which it is carried out: to baptise (Greek baptizein) means to "plunge" or "immerse"; the "plunge" into the water symbolises the catechumen's burial into Christ's death, from which he rises up by resurrection with him, as "a new creature."
- 1215 This sacrament is also called "the washing of regeneration and renewal by the Holy Spirit," for it signifies and actually brings about the birth of water and the Spirit without which no one "can enter the kingdom of God."
- "This bath is called enlightenment, because those who receive this [catechetical] instruction are enlightened in their understanding . . . "Having received in Baptism the Word, "the true light that enlightens every man," the person baptised has been "enlightened," he becomes a "son of light," indeed, he becomes "light" himself: Baptism is God's most beautiful and magnificent gift....

 We call it gift, grace, anointing, enlightenment, garment of immortality, bath of rebirth, seal, and most precious gift.

 It is called gift because it is conferred on those who bring nothing of their own; grace since it is given even to the guilty;

 Baptism because sin is buried in the water; anointing for it is priestly and royal as are those who are anointed; enlightenment because it radiates light; clothing since it veils our shame; bath because it washes; and seal as it is our guard and the sign of God's Lordship.
